CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Gorman called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

PUBLIC ADDRESS SESSION

Mike Hileman-AEP Proposed 765kV Power Line Mr. Hileman briefly reviewed the history of the 765kV power line from 1991 when American Electric Power (AEP) announced plans to build a major power line through the counties of Craig, Botetourt and Roanoke in Virginia. When the Forest Service released a draft Environmental Impact Statement, information was missing about the corridor in Montgomery County and the homes that would be impacted. Mr. Hileman said in reviewing documents provided before the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) that same information is missing from the AEP corridor maps. Mr. Hileman then thanked Board members who took the time to meet with community organizations about this issue.

Johnny Beth Moore-Community Services Ms. Moore addressed the Board about the clubhouse location for people with mental illness and retardation, which is now located in the Wimmer Building in downtown Christiansburg. She asked that the Board consider the recreation center that is being vacated on College Street for use as the clubhouse for special services.

Retired Teachers Association

Kitty Brennan, Chairman of the Retired Teachers Association volunteer committee, made a presentation to the Board in honor of the 50th anniversary of the National Retired Teachers Association. Ms. Brennan presented a symbolic check in the amount of \$27,768.00, which represented 2,136 hours of volunteer work during the past year, by thirteen retired teachers, at a rate of \$ 13 per hour. Volunteer work included educational, health groups such as the free clinic, hospital, hospice, etc.

American Electric Power-Proposed 765kV Power Line

On a motion by Henry F. Jablonski, seconded by Mary W. Biggs and carried unanimously,

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CONCERN
OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, VIRGINIA REGARDING
AEP'S 765KV WYOMING-CLOVERDALE
TRANSMISSION LINE PROJECT.

WHEREAS, On September 30, 1997, Appalachian Power Company d/b/a American Electric Power (“AEP”) filed an application (Case Number PUE 970766) with the Virginia State Corporation Commission (the “SCC”), seeking permission to build a 765kV transmission line from its Wyoming Station near Oceana, West Virginia to its Cloverdale Station at Cloverdale, Virginia, in order to maintain a reliable power supply to the Company’s central and eastern areas, including the County; and

WHEREAS, By resolutions dated September 12, 1994 and September 9, 1996 the Board supported AEP’s first preferred corridor, which is seventeen miles shorter, over all other routes which may be considered as a result of the Forest Service Study; and

WHEREAS, A portion of the latest proposed preferred corridor for the line passes through the County; and

WHEREAS, The Board is concerned about the potential impact of the proposed line upon residential development within the County; and

WHEREAS, Section 56-41.1 of the Code of Virginia 1950, as amended, requires the SCC to determine whether the proposed line is needed and whether the proposed route the line is to follow will reasonably minimize adverse impact on the residences, scenic assets, historic districts and environment of the area concerned, and further provides that the SCC may consider the effect of the proposed line on economic development and shall consider any improvements in reliability that may result from the proposed line; and

WHEREAS, The Board recognizes that there is significant public interest within the County and surrounding region in the proposed 765kV transmission line project and accordingly urges the Commission to provide for open and full public participation in the review process in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, The Board recognizes that maintaining a reliable power supply in the County and surrounding region is of critical importance in maintaining the vitality and competitiveness of existing businesses and industries, in encouraging the expansion of existing businesses and industries and in recruiting new employers to the County; and

WHEREAS, The Board recognizes that power interruptions can cause significant economic losses as well as adverse safety and health effects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery County, Virginia as follows:

1. The Board of Supervisors directs the County Administrator to request that the Virginia State Corporation Commission hold a public hearing in Montgomery County for the purpose of hearing public comment regarding the American Electric Power’s proposed route for a 765kV power line from Wyoming, West Virginia to Cloverdale, Virginia (PUE 970766).
2. The Board hereby requests the SCC, as it considers AEP’s application, to take into account the importance of reliable power to the economic well being, health and safety of the County and its residents, businesses and industries.
3. The Board hereby requests the SCC to complete its review of AEP’s application expeditiously and take all action necessary or desirable to provide for open and full public participation in the review process in accordance with applicable law.
4. Should the SCC approve the application, assure the route the line is to follow will minimize adverse impacts on the residences, scenic assets, historic districts and environment of the affected areas.
5. The Clerk of the Board is hereby directed to send certified copies of this Resolution to the Virginia State Corporation Commission, the West Virginia Public Service Commission and the United States Forest Service.

Request Continuance on AEP’s First Application

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

County Space Needs The County Administrator met with the Circuit Court Judge on this date to discuss space in the courthouse and the plans for addressing it. The County Administrator explained that the space occupied by the Mapping Department must be vacated prior to January 1, 1998 to provide additional space for the Commonwealth Attorney's Office; and the space occupied by the Planning Department is insufficient. He also explained to the Judge that the County is renting a space for the Purchasing Department at the present time.

The Judge said the County had indicated that after the Health and Human Services Building was completed, that within five years the County would address the space issues in the courthouse. He requested a specific plan as to exactly what was going to happen and when it was going to happen, to be provided at another meeting which should take place prior to the Thanksgiving holiday.

The Chairman asked that staff prepare a catalog of ideas to present to the Board at its next meeting.

BOARD MEMBERS' REPORTS

Supervisor Moore-Economic Development Commission Supervisor Moore reminded the Board of the Economic Development Commission (EDC) meeting on November 17th with the theme titled "the Future of Technology in Southwest Virginia".

Shell Building The steel is up and the pre-cast concrete is expected to arrive this week.

School Construction Information from the School Board was provided to Board members regarding the new high school at the Elliston site. They will be requesting additional funds in the initial amount of \$16,800 to provide construction drawings and bidding for the auxiliary gym with a reduced court size.

Supervisor Biggs said she attended the School Board meeting when this was discussed. Originally, the auxiliary gym had been taken out to reduce the cost of the project; then during community meetings, it was requested that this auxiliary gym be left in the plans. The School Board also discussed the fact that the old high school has a full-size gym, and they felt that having that gym and the auxiliary gym at the new high school would meet the needs of the community.

The Chairman asked that a resolution be prepared for the next agenda for the Board's

consideration. The Parks and Recreation Director will be requested to provide documentation of support from the Parks and Recreation Commission prior to the next Board meeting. The Chairman suggested that there be a memorandum of understanding of how the use of that facility would be utilized.

Supervisor Stewart-Coyotes 35-40 lambs and sheep, geese, turkeys, chickens, and a colt have been killed recently by coyotes. Supervisor Stewart asked if the County Attorney could research the feasibility of enacting a policy to pay a bounty for coyotes.

Health Department Supervisor Stewart said he has tried several times to telephone the Health Department, but unable to get his call put through. The County Administrator will provide Dr. Hershey's direct number to Board members.

Supervisor Biggs-Planning Commission The Planning Commission will continue to work on the zoning ordinance revisions through November and December. A revised draft will be available by the first of the year.

Audio Problems in the Board Room During the last Planning Commission meeting, the public was unable to hear in the back of the Board Room. Supervisor Biggs asked that someone be available to put the speakers out prior to the meetings.

Supervisor Long-Utilities Committee will meet tomorrow (Tuesday) morning at 10:00 a.m. at the PSA building.

Joint Meeting with Planning Commission and PSA There will be a joint meeting with the PSA and the Planning Commission on November 18, 1997 at 7:00 p.m. Supervisor Long asked that either the Law Library, or the meeting room at the Health and Human Services Building be reserved for this meeting.

Supervisor Jablonski-Planning District Commission At their last meeting, there was discussing about forming a committee to address the issues related to the proposed 765kV power line. It was decided that the committee would be made up of representatives from counties which would not be impacted by the power line, as well as representatives from counties that would be impacted. Supervisor Jablonski will be the representative for Montgomery County.

Sign at Blacksburg High School Supervisor Jablonski has received a strong complaint from a citizen about the sign at Blacksburg High School which prohibits use of the track. Since citizens are allowed to use the track facilities at other schools in the county, Supervisor Jablonski asked that the County Administrator contact Blacksburg High School and ask for an explanation.

Chairman Gorman-Cellular Towers According to an article in a newspaper, the Federal Communications Commission is, in essence, taking away land use control from local governments. Supervisor Gorman asked that the County Administrator investigate this matter, and if the Board should take a position as a local government.

Supervisor Stewart-County Garage Supervisor Stewart said there is a tree blocking the view as you come out from the county garage, and asked that it be cut down.

Chairman Gorman-765kV power line impact on New River The Chairman asked that the County Attorney look into the report on that part of the New River that is to be affected by the power line, and its designation as a scenic river.

Supervisor Biggs-765kV power line Supervisor Biggs thanked the Chairman for all the work he has put into gathering information on this matter, and expressed her appreciation to the Chairman for taking the time to explain the matter to her.

Resolution Opposing Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Rule

On a motion by Ira D. Long, seconded by Mary W. Biggs and carried unanimously,

WHEREAS, The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has issued FCC Rule Making Docket 97-182, Preemption of local zoning over television and radio broadcast towers;

WHEREAS, Land use is a function of local government to preserve citizen participation in decisions regarding the use of land within their community;

WHEREAS, The FCC rule making Docket 97-187, usurps the power and authority of local governments to control land use and zoning in their communities; thereby excluding citizens from the decision-making process in the use of land in their communities;

WHEREAS, Local governments are best positioned to identify the adverse impacts such towers may have on the residences, scenic assets, historic districts and the environment of their local communities;

WHEREAS, The Virginia Association of Counties (VACo) and the National Association of Counties (NACO) oppose FCC Rule Making Docket 97-187;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery County, Virginia as follows:

1. The Board strongly opposes FCC Rule Making Docket 97-182, Preemption of local zoning over television and radio broadcast towers.
2. The Board strongly supports the position of NACO and VACo too preserve local zoning authority; and
3. The Board strongly believes it should be the authority of local government to decide the use of land within its communities.

ADJOURNMENT
